
Georgian Ambassador attends St Anthimos Monastery patronal feast: Georgia and Romania have a common saint

"St Anthimos the Iberian, a Georgian-born Romanian Archbishop of the Orthodox Church in Wallachia (18th century), is a common Saint of the Georgian and Romanian sister Churches."

Due to their common spiritual and cultural heritage, Saint Anthimos Monastery and the Embassy of Georgia have held several cultural and protocol events, such as Georgian officials' visits to the monastery and the Holy Synod Library, which operates within the monastery's premises.

St. Anthimos monastery was founded by the Hieromartyr Anthimos the Iberian, and the Synaxis of All Saints was chosen as the patronal feast by the holy hierarch and founder of this monastic settlement.
