
Rhetorical competition at HUFS University (South Korea) with reference to Ancient Greece, Byzantium and the Ecumenical Patriarchate

First prize in the Rhetoric Competition was awarded to second-year student Justinian Choi Junhui with a prize of 200,000 won.

During the program, the freshmen's choir sang three Greek songs, and a Greek short film was shown with Korean subtitles translated by the third-year students.
