**UOC Primate: A goal of spiritual feat is to attain** grace of the Holy Spirit



Attainment of the Holy Spirit will not only help a person lead an earthly life with dignity, but also will ordain eternity in the Kingdom of Heaven.

The whole life of Monk Seraphim of Sarov was an answer to all disputes about the true purpose of human life on earth, noted the Primate of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, His Beatitude Metropolitan Onuphry of Kiev and All Ukraine during the sermon on the day of the saint's memory. This was reported by the <u>Information and Education Department of the UOC</u>.

According to His Beatitude, it was the Venerable Seraphim of Sarov who "showed with his life how man can and should live on earth".

"Some say that a person should fast all his life and so he fulfills his destination, others say that a person should repent his whole life, others say that a person should visit the weak to help them," said the Archpastor. "But Rev. Seraphim is the saint who said clearly and distinctly what the purpose of man's earthly life is. The goal of human feats on earth is the acquisition of the grace of the Holy Spirit."

His Beatitude emphasized that "not fasting, not prayer, not repenting, not visiting

the sick is the goal of a person's life, but it is only a means of attaining the grace of the Holy Spirit ... Because the grace of the Holy Spirit is bestowed to a human being for his humility. The Holy Apostle Peter says that 'God gives grace to the humble' (1 Pet. 5: 5)."

"All the deeds that a person commits in praying, repenting, and helping the weak are means to humble oneself. And when we humble ourselves before God, then God gives us grace. What is God's grace? It is a force that not only gives us life, but which strengthens us, makes us worthy of the title of human; it is a force which comforts us, relieves our illnesses, helps us endure, love and forgive," His Beatitude Onuphry explained.

Concluding his sermon, the Primate wished us to perform our spiritual feat on earth "so that it would lead us to humility, while humility, in turn – to attaining the Holy Spirit, which would not only help us lead a worthy earthly life, but also ordain eternity in the Kingdom of Heaven."
