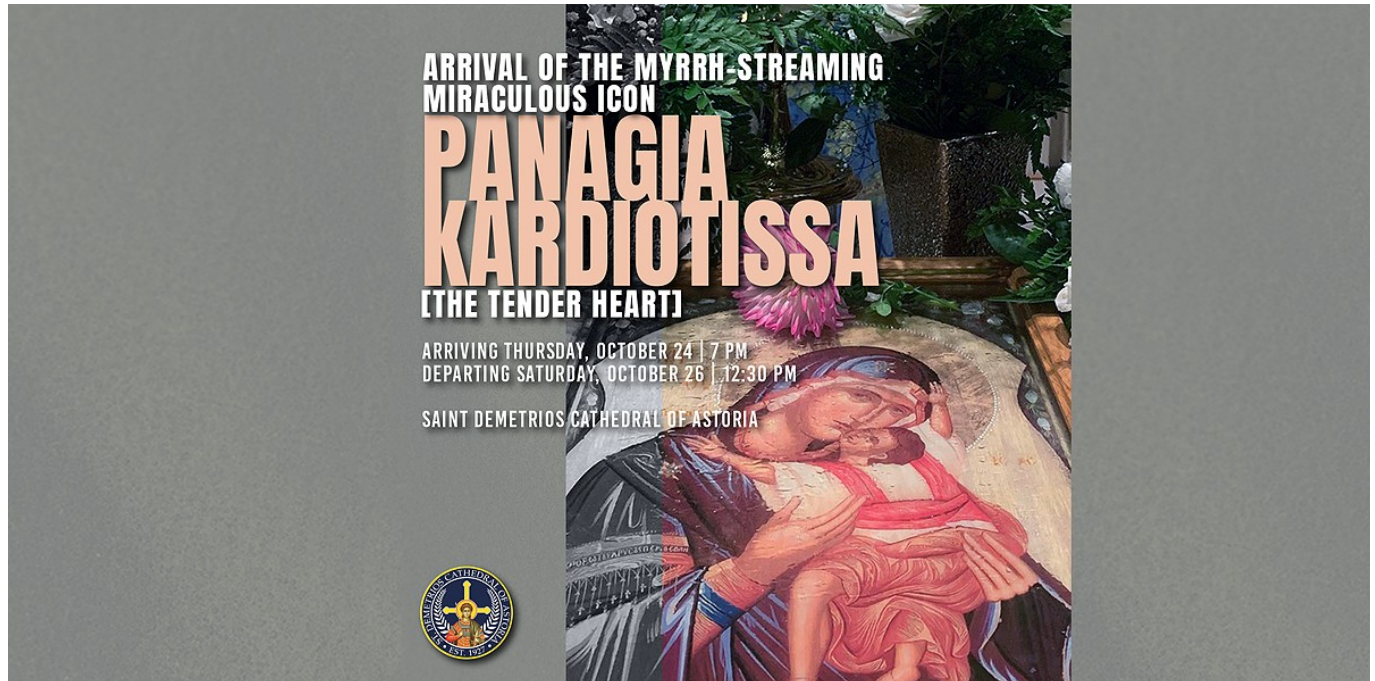


Myrrh-Streaming, Miracle-Working Icon Panagia Kardiotissa Arriving at St. Demetrios Cathedral Astoria
