
At the end of the event, Archbishop Makarios extended warm congratulations to the organisers and participants, while expressing his paternal joy and satisfaction for the fact that the Greek Orthodox community is moving towards the great celebration of Christmas in a spirit of love and unity.



His Eminence then referred to God's infinite love for humankind, which is revealed by the fact of His incarnation. He recalled a characteristic saying of Saint John Chrysostom, that God "takes my flesh to sanctify me; He gives me His Spirit to save me." "God approached us with love to show us the way back to Him," His Eminence emphasised, explaining that our presence in the world is temporary and that our destination is the Kingdom of God.

"What Christmas should remind us of," he emphasised, "is that there is something that comes after." He urged everyone to follow the path of returning to God, namely the example of Christ who became a perfect man and walked this earth.
