Patriarch Theophilos III Receives the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Greece at the Patriarchate

In light of these pressing realities, the Minister reaffirmed Greece's resolute solidarity with the Patriarchate and pledged tangible support for the ongoing humanitarian and rehabilitation efforts in Gaza.

Another key subject of discussion was the critical importance of academic opportunities for Palestinian youth. His Beatitude emphasized the necessity of renewed scholarship programs for students seeking higher education in Greece, recognizing that the intellectual and spiritual formation of future generations is vital for the continuity of Christian life in the Holy Land. The Minister, in turn, expressed his willingness to explore new avenues for educational support, acknowledging that fortifying Christian presence requires the preservation of sacred spaces as well as the empowerment of the faithful through knowledge and enlightenment.

At the conclusion of this fraternal exchange, His Beatitude and the Minister solemnly reaffirmed their shared commitment to the principles of faith, peace, and the protection of Christianity's sacred heritage in the Holy Land. As a token of mutual respect, they exchanged gifts, symbolizing the deep-rooted and unbreakable bond between the Mother Church and the Hellenic Republic.
