May the grace of God always bless those who open paths for the children of the world. To the Holy Archdiocese of Australia and to His Eminence Archbishop Makarios, the Church of Southern Madagascar extends a humble but heartfelt "thank you." Through their love, not just a school was built; a future full of hope was built.
