Patriarch of Alexandria awarded the Grand Cross of Leo to the outgoing Greek ambassador to Cairo



The Primate of the Orthodox Church of Alexandria, Theodore II, presented on August 29, 2019, the Grand Cross of Leo of the Patriarchate of Alexandria to the outgoing Greek Ambassador to Cairo Michael-Christos Diamessis.

"You should always remember our Patriarchate of Alexandria, fighting for a better tomorrow, for justice and peace in Africa," the Patriarch concluded.

On his part, the outgoing Greek Ambassador Michael-Christos Diamessis warmly thanked the Patriarch for everything he has done for Africa, Greece and Greek diaspora in Egypt.

The outgoing Greek ambassador is leaving Cairo to take over his new position in Ankara on September 9.
