Patriarch of Bulgaria celebrates Mid-Pentecost Feast at the Ancient Church of Saint Sophia in Sofia



On 14 May 2025—25 days after the feast day of the Resurrection of Christ—the Orthodox Church celebrates the Feast of Mid-Pentecost. To mark the occasion, a festive Divine Liturgy was held at the historic Church of Saint Sophia in Sofia, which honours the day as its second patronal feast. The service was presided over by His Beatitude Patriarch Daniel of Bulgaria, joined by His Grace Bishop Gerasim of Melnik and numerous clergy from the diocese.

The service was beautifully accompanied by the church choir, and following the Liturgy, Patriarch Daniel delivered a pastoral address.
