
Vatopedi Abbot awarded Romanian Patriarchate's highest distinction



The Very Rev. Archimandrite Efrem Koutsou, Abbot of Vatopedi Monastery on Mount Athos, received the highest distinction of the Romanian Patriarchate, the Patriarchal Cross.


The ceremony took place last Friday in the Hall of the Romanian Saints at the Patriarchal Residence, immediately after the reception of the relics of Saint John Chrysostom.

The distinction was awarded for "his long-standing, fruitful, and beneficial service to the Church and society."



In this context, Patriarch Daniel of Romania expressed his appreciation for the continuous spiritual work of Vatopedi Monastery and its significant contribution to Orthodoxy and monasticism.
