

The President of the Hellenic Republic attends the Celebration of the Patron Saint of Patras, Saint Andrew the First-Called



The President of the Hellenic Republic, Konstantinos Tassoulas, attended the celebration of the memory of the Patron and Protector of Patras, the Holy Apostle Andrew the First-Called.

In the magnificent church dedicated to the Saint, the Festal Divine Liturgy was celebrated, presided over by His Eminence Metropolitan Ierotheos of Nafpaktos and Agios Vlasios. This was followed by the Doxology and the grand Procession of the Precious Relic of the Apostle Andrew's Holy Head and his Sacred Icon, led by the local hierarch, His Eminence Metropolitan Chrysostomos of Patras.

After the conclusion of the procession, President Mr. Tassoulas made the following statement:
