To them he bestowed the highest honour of the Holy Archdiocese: the Medal of the Order of the Christ-loving. "It is the least we can do," His Eminence remarked, offering words of gratitude for their long and invaluable service to the


Kingsford Parish and, more broadly, to the local Church of Australia.
