

The Feast of Christmas celebrated at the Vatopedi Metochion in Galata, Constantinople

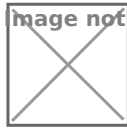


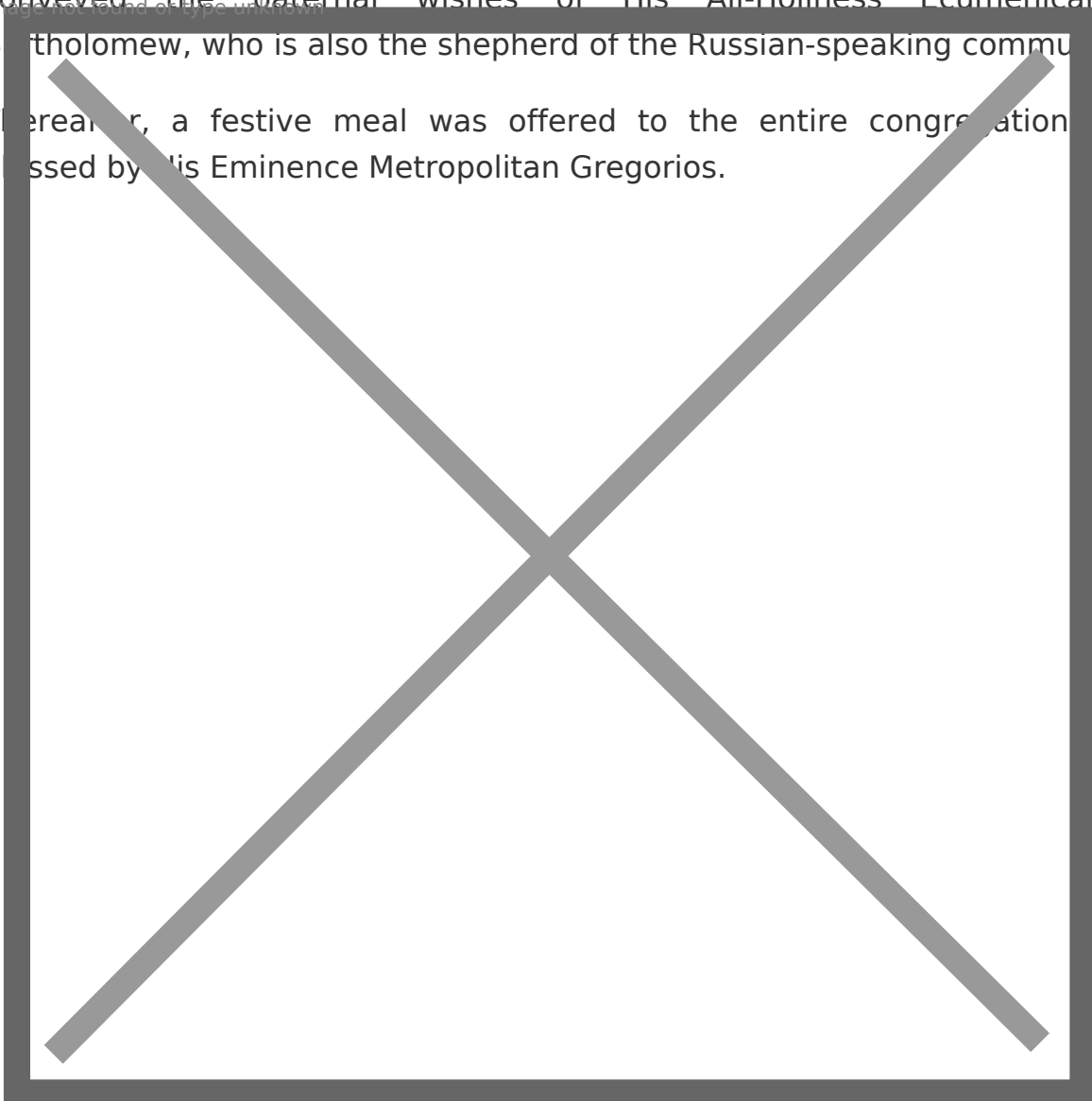

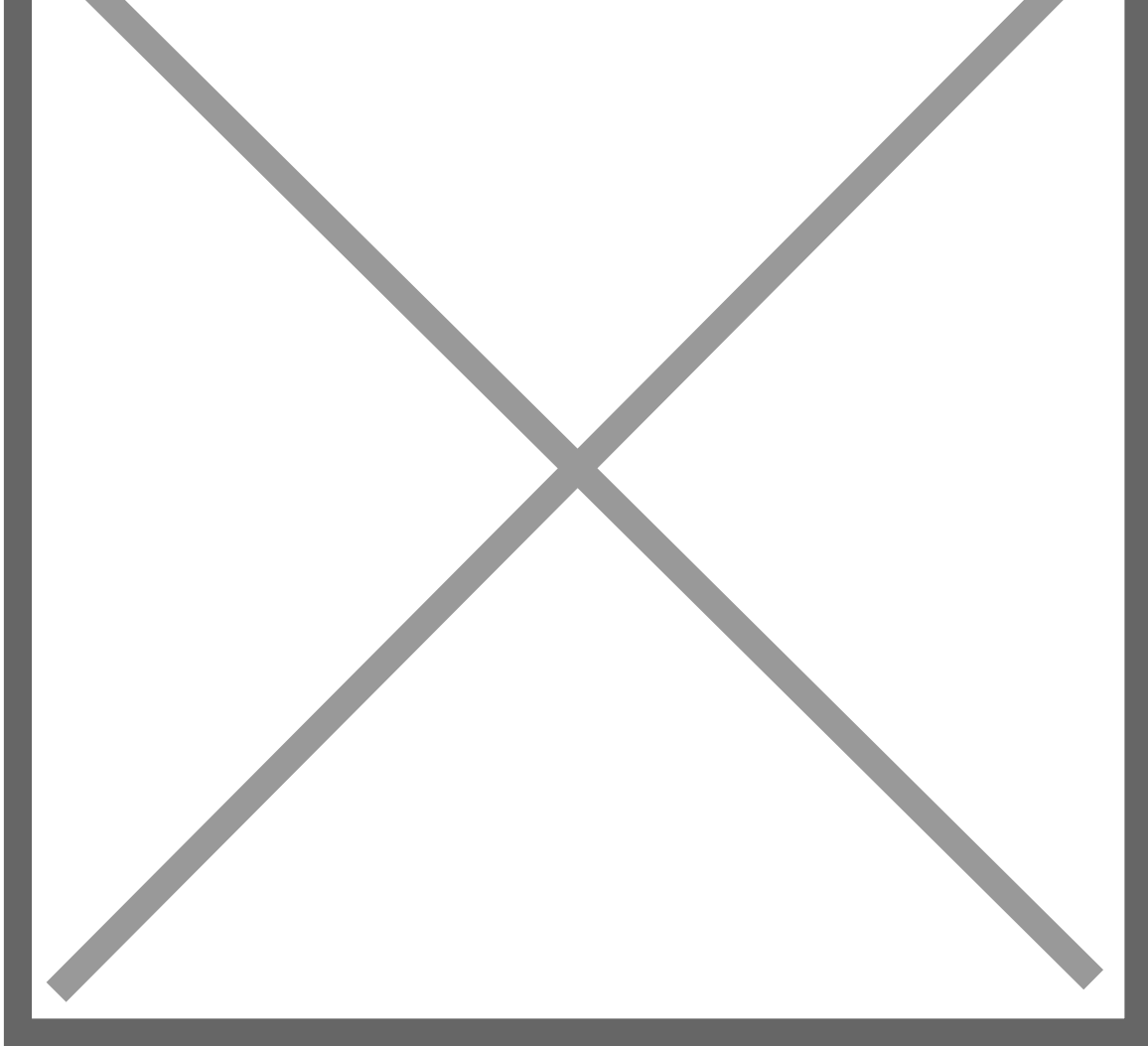
Thereafter, a festive meal was offered to the entire congregation which was blessed by His Eminence Metropolitan Gregorios.











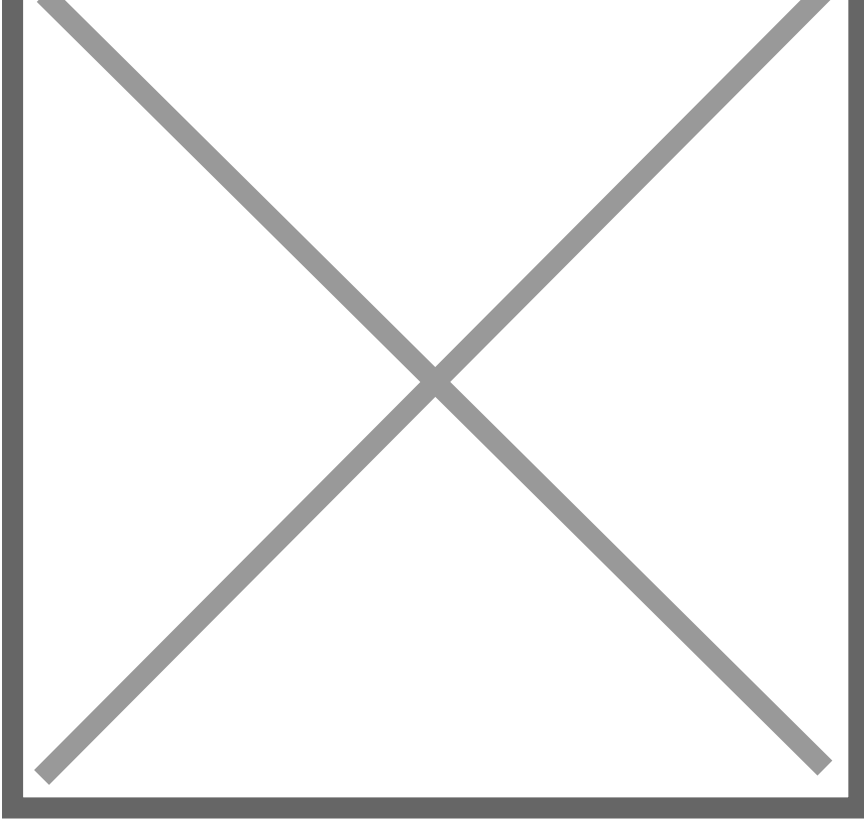

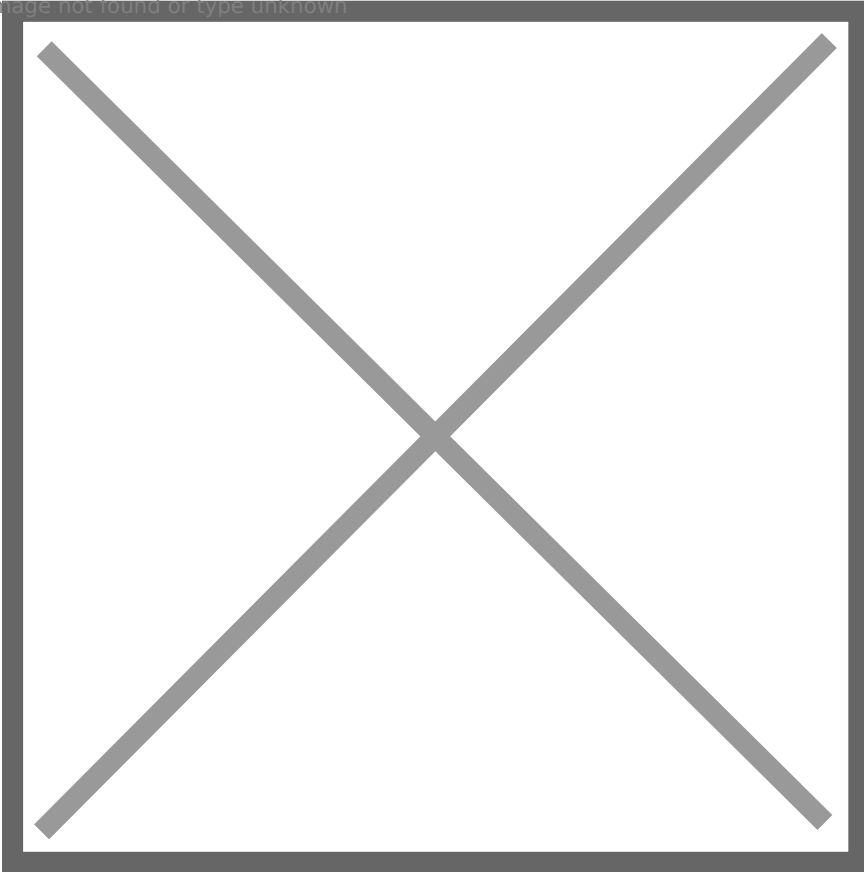
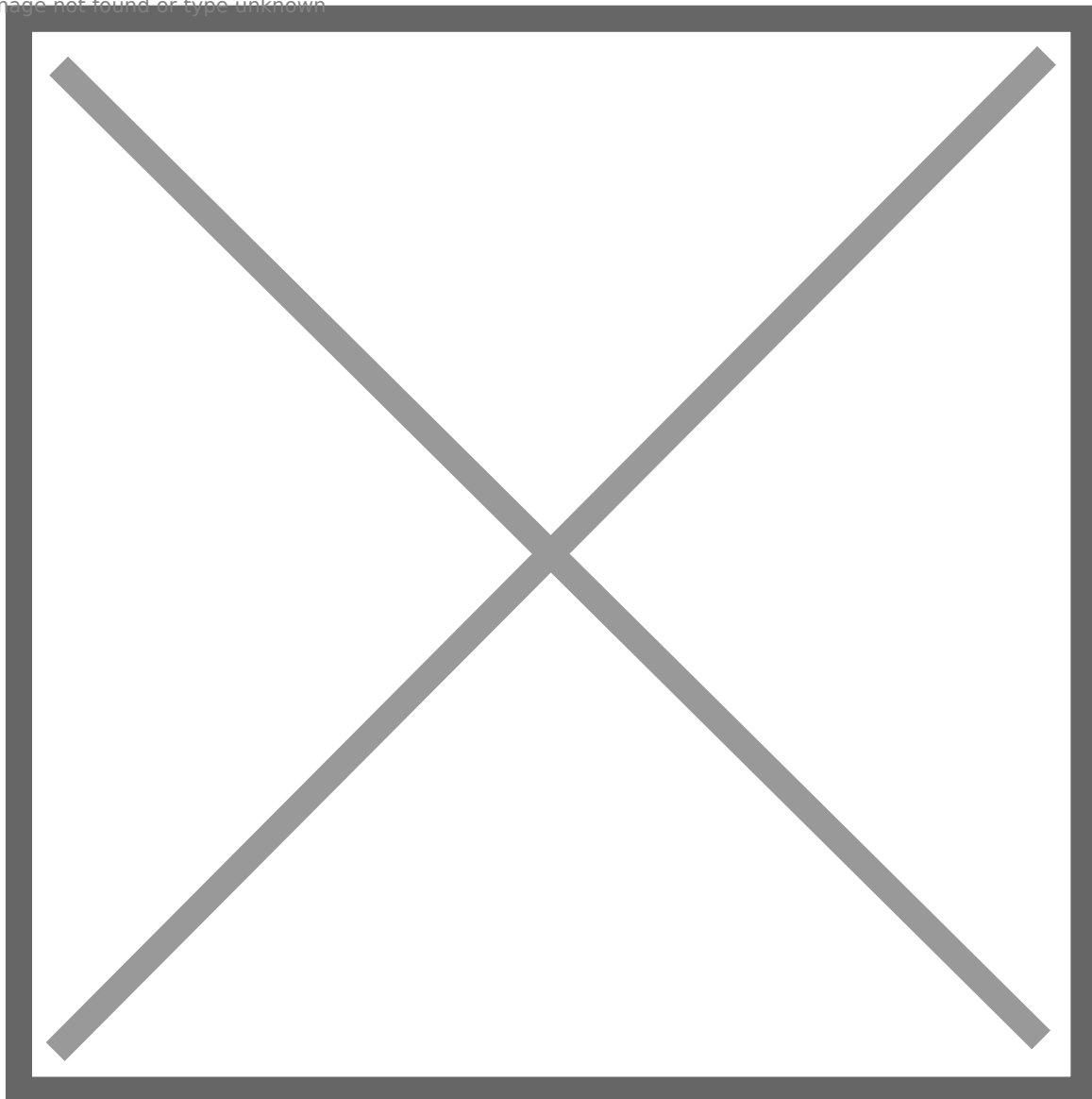
