

Reopening of Greek Orthodox Cathedral of Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Tanta, Egypt



The Greek Orthodox Cathedral of Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in Tanta, Egypt, reopened on Friday, during a ceremony in the presence of the Patriarch of Alexandria and All Africa, His Divine Beatitude Theodoros II.

The historic cathedral served the faithful of a once flourishing ethnic Greek community, roughly midway between Cairo and Alexandria.

Following a merger of the Greek community of Tanta with its sister group in Cairo, the cathedral passed into the possession of the latter, which has allocated a significant sum for the building's renovation.
