Patriarch Daniel attends Romanian Patriarchate's Annual Christmas Carol Concert



Patriarch Daniel attended the annual Christmas Carol Concert on Monday evening at the Palace of the Patriarchate in Bucharest in honour of His Beatitude's patron Saint, the Holy Prophet Daniel.
