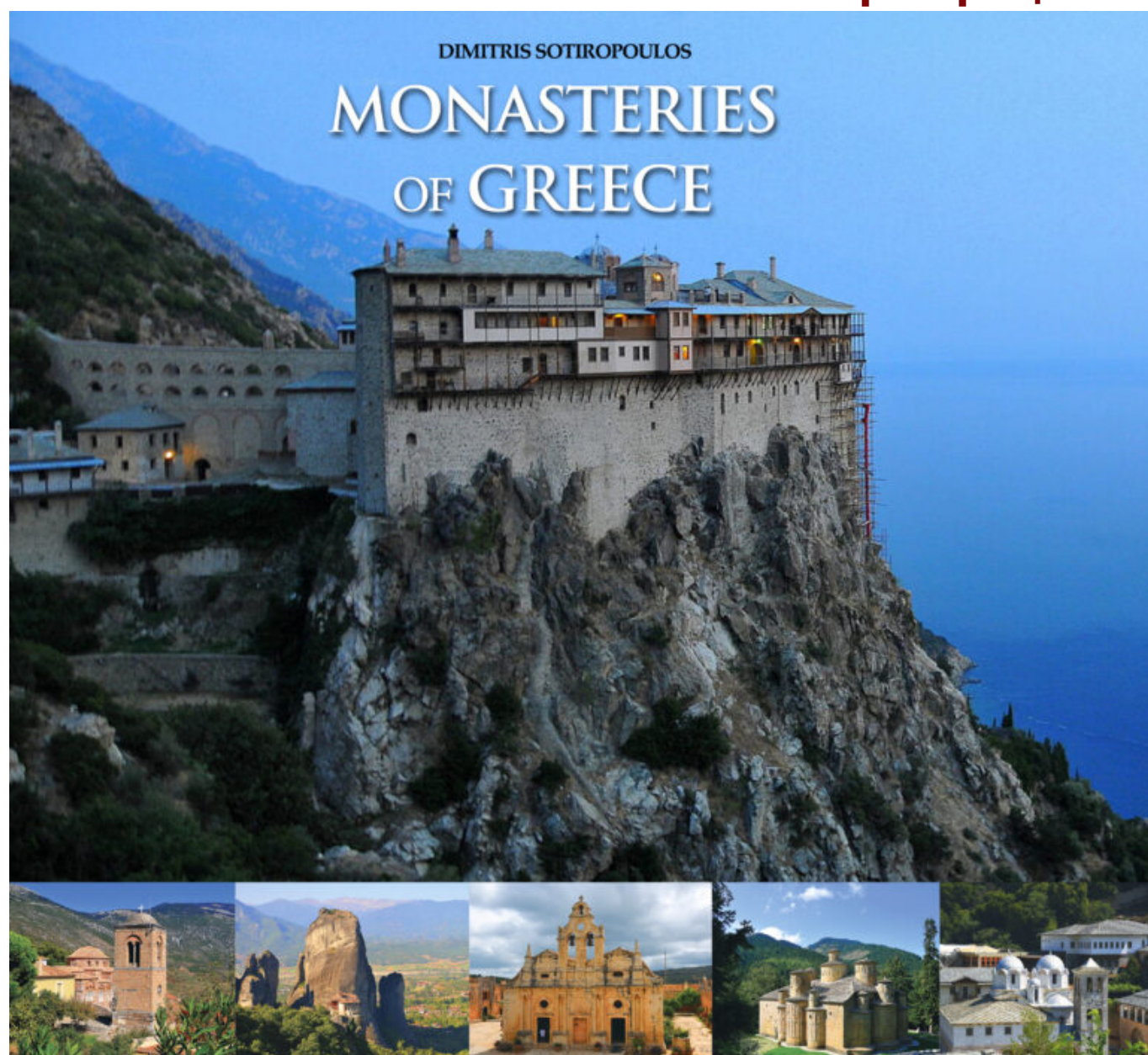


MONASTERIES OF GREECE - Μοναστήρι Γρεции

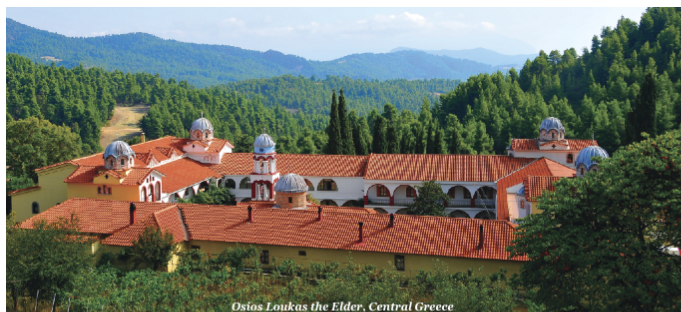

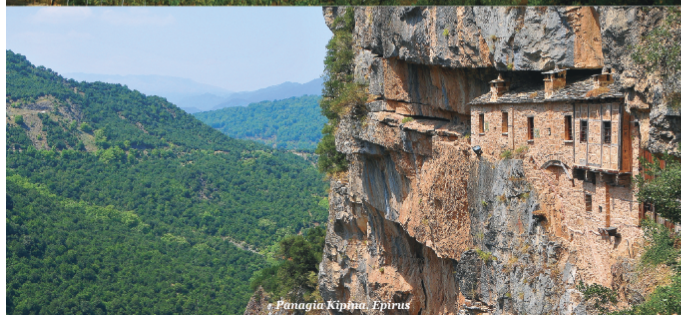

Introduction



Dimitris Sotiropoulos was born in Athens in 1979 and lives in Piraeus. He is a Photographer, Writer and Publisher, with origins from Peloponnese and Crete. He also works as a Freelance Photographer for Getty Images, one of the world's biggest stock photo agencies.

Until now, he has published eleven books. Three about Mount Athos and the other eight for the Monasteries of Peloponnese, Central Greece, Meteora, Thessaly, Epirus, Macedonia & Thrace, Crete and Cyclades.

All these books include hundreds of high resolution photos, detailed descriptions and informations about the Orthodox Greek Monasteries. They are unique for their quality and educational value.

"Monasteries of Greece" is the 12th book of Dimitris Sotiropoulos Publication and the first one in the English language.

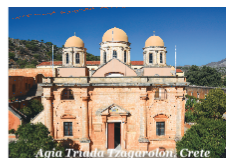

Every chapter has, at its end, contact informations (Telephone, Address etc) of the described Monastery. There are also maps with the exact positions of the Monasteries in every prefecture, so a visitor could easily find them.

Almost 200 Monasteries are included in this book: From Mount Athos, the only untouched monastic community of the world to the most populated area of Greece, Attica, we pass through Central Greece and Peloponnese, before travel to the famous Monasteries of Meteora, Thessaly, Epirus, Macedonia and Thrace, with very important Byzantine Monasteries, are also included. Finally, you can read about the Holy Sites of Crete and Cyclades Islands.

We hope that you will find useful the book, as a travel and pilgrimage guide to the Orthodox Greek Monasteries. After all-who knows?-we could meet in one of them...

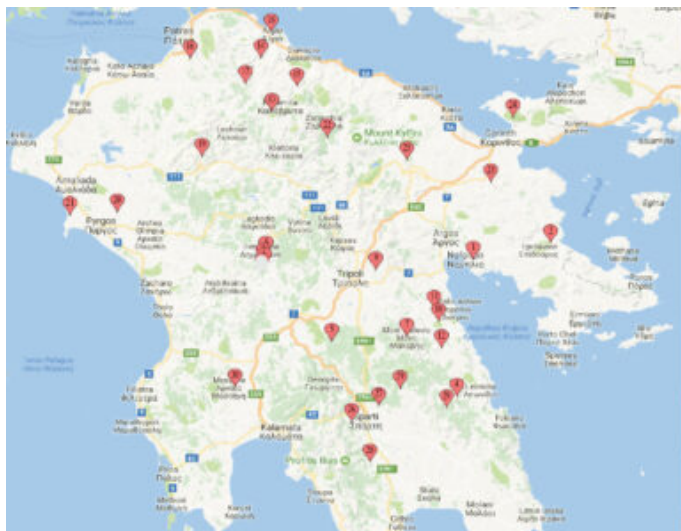

PELOPONNESE

Holy Monastery of Timios Prodromos in Akritochori

This magnificent holy retreat, also called the Women's Hermitage or Convent of Saint John the Baptist, rises above the village of Akritochori, with unsurpassed views of Lake Kerkini and the wetland. A dependency of the Holy Monastery of Xenophon of Mount Athos, the convent was built according to the architectural standards of that Holy Mountain.

Established in 1981, it is a monastery with over 35 nuns living there. It receives many visitors from both the prefecture of Serres and neighboring prefectures. Its interesting architecture is surrounded by landscaped outdoor areas with grass and trees. The Holy Monastery of Saint John the Baptist, or Timios Prodromos, celebrates on August 29.

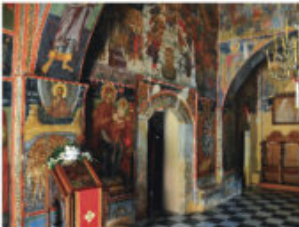
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Holy Monastery of Agioi Tessarakonta

A beautiful, green location near Chrysafa, approximately 8 km northwest of Sparta, is one of the most important Monasteries in Lakonia, dedicated to Holy Forty Martyrs (Agioi Tessarakonta). It was founded in 1305 a little bit higher, at the gorge of the stream of Sofronis, and was transferred to the present day location in the beginning of the 17th century. At the old Monastery the church has been constructed inside a natural formed cave and was painted by Constantine Masanes. Initially at the present day location were only the fields and its warehouses, but gradually the area became a metochi, and finally it became the main building of the complex, mainly due to the problems in the provision of goods and the safety of the monks. The Monastery became a strategic one in the 16th century and had several privileges, which allowed it to evolve into an important intellectual centre. In 1770 it was torched by the Turco-Albanians and was abandoned, but it operated again in the years of the Revolution of 1821, and it proved to make a significant contribution to supplies and food. It was torched again in 1826 by Ibrahim, and in 1943 by the Germans.

Externally it has the form of a fortress with a tall precinct shaped by the complex of the cells and the auxiliary areas. At the centre of the yard is the Cathedral, a cross-in-square church with a dome, which was built in 1620. The wall paintings, of 1820, are the work of Georgios Moschos, famous painter of the Cretan School from Nafplio. Next to the Cathedral is the chapel of Zoodochos Pigi (Life Giving Source) which dates from 1707 and is said to host the underground, secret school in the years of the Turkish Occupation. The Monastery has an excellent library, relics and rare documents that are exhibited at its museum.



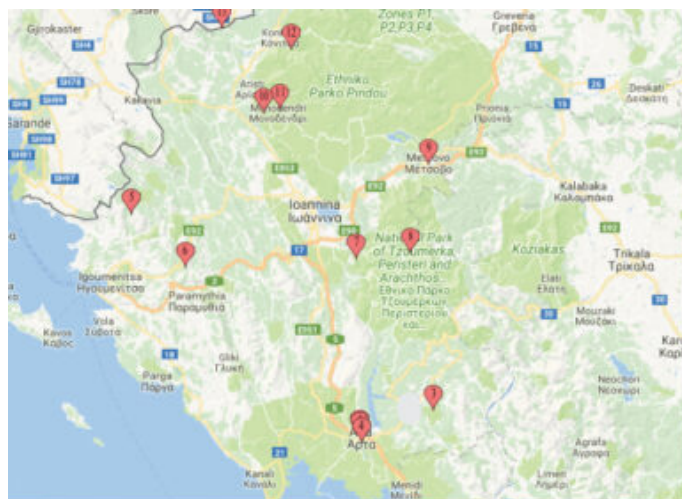
