Greek dep. citizens' protection minister: public should respect measures imposed against non-essential movement outdoors



Greece's deputy citizens' protection minister, Lefteris Economou, spoke by Skype with the Orthodoxia News Agency this week, answering questions on the safeguarding of Greece's land and sea borders amid the coronavirus pandemic, in tandem with a resurgent migrant crisis faced by the country on its eastern borders.
