Greek Education Students Graduate in Virtual Commencement Ceremony

Selected students were also offered the opportunity to offer brief speeches.

In early May, Director of Education Dr. Anastasios Koularmanis announced that all Greek Day Schools and parish programs would hold a combined graduation ceremony virtually due to COVIS-19 concerns. All schools moved all their classes online in mid-March and have plans to re-open in the fall.
