Vucic asked Russia to support the Serbian Orthodox Church

And I asked and said Serbia will continue its support and Putin's arrival at the opening ceremony of the magnificent Church of Saint Sava will mean an additional impetus not only for our cultural and religious relations, but will also strengthen the position of our people and our country.
