
## AHEPA Opens Emergency Relief Fund to Assist California Wildfires, Hurricane Victims

AHEPA established the Emergency Relief Fund 15 years ago. Since its inception

more than \$1 million has been donated from the fund to assist those affected by national disasters.

"Although we are not the Red Cross, we are a compassionate, service-oriented Order that cares about the well-being of individuals and communities in the spirit of projecting Hellenic principles," Horiates said. "As always, we appreciate the grassroots mobilization of our chapters and members. Let's dig deep to do our part and to help our communities as we have done since 1922."
