Furthermore, the film vividly depicted how St. Joseph overcame every passion through exercising much patience, prayer, and obedience.

At the conclusion of the film, His Grace Bishop Silouan gave a closing speech. His Grace related that even though Saint Joseph wept over his human weaknesses, Christ was still with him.
