Last year, on the feast day of St. Catherine, the external renovation of the church was completed.




We were able to stand many times at the highest point of the Cathedral, at a height of about 15 meters, and to touch the ceiling of the church.


The scaffolding is gone and we will celebrate Christmas in the newly renovated church.


