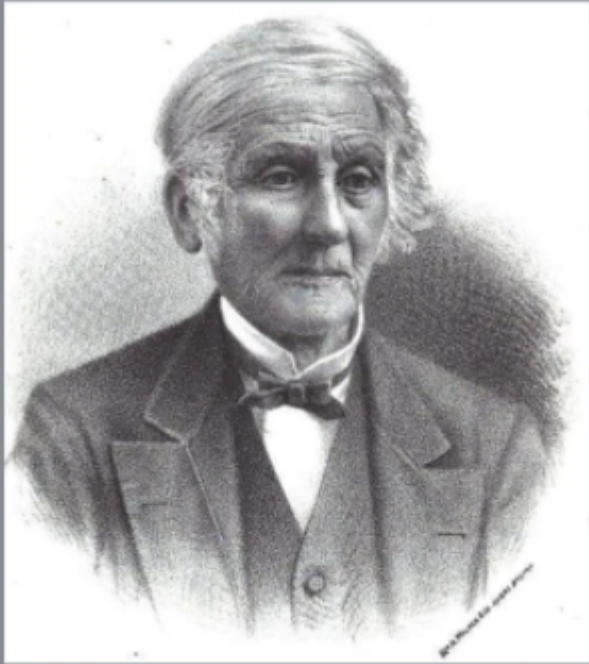

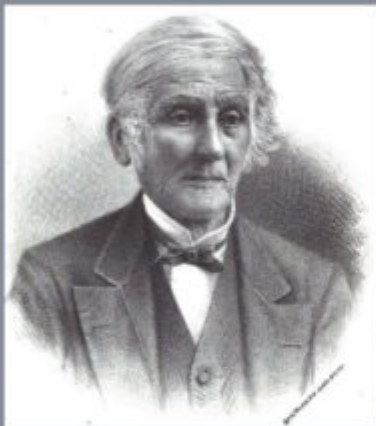

Thomas W. Gallant specializes in Modern Greek History and Archeology. His most recently published books are *The Edinburgh History of the Greeks, volume 9: The Long Nineteenth Century, Πολιτισμός, ταυτότητα και εξουσία στα Επτάνησα, 1817-1884: Βαλμπατα αποικιακής κυριαρχίας* and *Murder on Black Mountain: Love and Death on a Nineteenth Century Greek Island*. In progress are: *Modern Greece: Society, Politics and Economy; Νεώτερη Ελλάδα. Μια κοινωνική και πολιτική ιστορία*, *Outlaws: Bandits, Pirates and the Making of the Modern World*, and *Athens: A Social History*. He is also the author of *Modern Greece, Experiencing Dominion: Culture, Identity and Power in the British Mediterranean*, and *The 1918 Anti-Greek Riot in Toronto*. He is the editor-in-chief of the ten-volume *Edinburgh History of the Greeks*. In addition, he is the co-director of the UC San Diego Center for Hellenic Studies and a past president of the Modern Greek Studies Association.
