Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America Celebrates Greek Bicentennial



The Greek Orthodox Archdiocese commemorated the Bicentennial of the Greek Revolution of 1821 on Thursday, with a live streamed event.

Greek and US politicians, Greek-American leaders and the CEO of Pfizer, Albert Bourla, participated in the event.

Cyprus President Nicos Anastasiades, the Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis and the leader of main opposition Alexis Tsipras also read statements for the event.

George Stephanopoulos, the Chief Anchor for ABC News, served as Master of Ceremonies and award-winning actor Dennis Boutsikaris provided narration to videos featuring historical and modern themes on the Revolution of 1821 and its relevance to our modern day.

The event began with a Doxology, or a service of thanksgiving, presided over by Archbishop Elpidophoros of America, and was followed by live musical presentations and videos.

In accordance to COVID measures in place during this time in the USA, this celebration was a hybrid event, with both in-person speeches and speeches via video.
