

His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America Remarks for the Centennial of the Parish Saint George Greek Orthodox Church



My Beloved Christians,

What a wonderful day to be present with you to celebrate the Divine Liturgy and the Centennial of this precious parish of Saint George the Great-martyr and Trophy-bearer.

As you may know, today is the Sunday when we celebrate the Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council – the Sacred Synod that confirmed the Church’s perennial teachings about the Holy Icons, their veneration and theological value.

As we look around this Temple – named for the great Saint George – we see the fruits of this Seventh Holy Council, because you have honored the living tradition of Icons with a truly stunning iconographic program.
