

Patriarch Teoctist remembered in his home village: “He was like a brother to us”



Romania’s former Patriarch Teoctist Arăpașu was prayerfully remembered in the courtyard of his native house in Tocileni, Botoșani County, on his 107th birth anniversary. The parish priest of Tocileni said that Patriarch Teoctist was as close as a brother to the villagers.

Dozens of locals, including relatives of the former Romanian Patriarch, took part in the memorial service.

“He was close to the people, to the faithful, to us, the priests, he was like a brother of ours,” said Father Octavian Pododu, the parish priest of Tocileni, Press online reports.

The mayor of Stăuceni commune, Cosmin Epuraș, also present, confessed his

admiration for Patriarch Teoctist. "We are happy to celebrate the most famous son of the village," the mayor said.
