

Byzantine Iconography Classes at the Orthodox Metropolis of Korea



Lessons on byzantine iconography, organized by the Orthodox Metropolis of Korea at its headquarters, with the participation of 18 students, Orthodox and non-Orthodox alike, began on Monday morning, May 20, 2019.
